Constitutional Amendment I: Student Participation

Undergraduate student members whose cumulative grade point average (GPA) falls below 3.10 are maintained on inactive status until such time as their GPA reaches the required level. During this time they may not hold an office, serve as mentors, or wear honor cords at graduation. This requirement applies to graduate student members whose cumulative grade point average falls below 3.30. Chapters may make this determination on a semester-by-semester basis or by review of each academic year, whichever meets their needs more appropriately.

In order to maintain active membership in their chapter, students must attend at least 50% of the meetings held by that chapter and actively participate in at least one event/activity sponsored by their chapter each year (if such events/activities) are held by that chapter. Chapters may establish stricter criteria for participation.

If it has been determined that a student member of Delta Alpha Pi Honor Society has cheated, that student will be placed on inactive status and may not participate in any meetings or activities held by the chapter or represent the chapter in any manner; he/she may not hold an office, serve as a mentor, or wear honor cords at graduation. These restrictions shall be maintained for the period of time that the student is placed under other college or university restrictions (e.g., probation).

Constitutional Amendment II: Chapter Responsibilities

In order to maintain active status, each chapter is responsible for contacting the national office at least once each academic year, preferably as soon as membership has been confirmed by the chapter. Chapter advisors or a designee should provide a list that includes the following information regarding current chapter members:

- Names
- Addresses
- E-mail addresses

This information will be maintained by the national office in order to confirm numbers of student members and to ensure that chapters are active.
